

Selectmen Meeting Minutes
May 18, 2022

Meeting called to order by Selectmen Norman Beckwith at 6:03pm.

Calling of the Roll

Norman made a motion to accept the minutes as written. David seconded. Motion carried 3-0.

The Treasure's warrant was handed out.

Norman has left messages about putting in a furnace in the Fire Department for a price but has had no responses yet.

Colin has spoken to Norman about wanting to cut on the Blanchard Road this coming winter.

Norman has put some wire around the mouth of the culvert down by the dam to prevent the beavers from putting long trees down the culvert.

Norman put a load of chips by the bridge.

Pleasant River donated chips for the playground.

Gene Turner asked if he could pasture his 5 cows on town property again this year. Norman said he could with the understanding that he needs to put up temporary fencing to keep the cows contained and that he is responsible if the cows get out.

Norman made a motion to let Gene Turner graze his cows on the town property. David seconded. Motion carried 3-0.

Derek presented to the selectmen a signed petition to change the Land Use Ordinance with the words Accessory Dwelling Units instead of only 1 residential dwelling is aloud per lot. He asked if it could be put in an article in the warrant to be voted on by the town residents.

Norman said that the signed petition can not be put into the town warrant. Norman explained to Derek the first thing do is take it to the Planning Board. The Planning

Board will then discuss it and either approve or deny the request. If denied, then it can be taken to the Appeals Board.

The Selectmen discussed presenting the oldest resident with The Boston Post Cane Award sometime this year.

Norman adjourned the meeting at 8:46pm.
