Explanation: The school administrative unit's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to Grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act is the amount of money determined by state law to be the minimum amount that a municipality must raise in order to receive the full amount of state dollars.

ARTICLE 18

To see what sum the Town of Shirley will raise and appropriate in additional local funds (Recommend \$274,882.38), which exceeds the State's Essential Programs and Services allocation model by \$274,882.38 as required to fund the budget recommended by the Shirley School Committee.

The Shirley School Committee recommends \$274,882.38 for additional local funds and gives the following reasons for exceeding the State's Essential Programs and Services funding model by \$274,882.38. The EPS funding model is based on teacher/student ratios, this impacts small rural schools because they are required to provide the same level of educational services to a smaller population of students.
